Already, I sense that working with BMC provides an avenue for my interests in creative nonviolence, art, and working to bring about transformation in the Brethren and Mennonite traditions to merge. ## 3. Support Your Volunteer

Kay is the 10th full time volunteer for BMC. She joins a proud and very talented group of young adults who have given a year or more of their time to the movement for lgbtq justice, contributing to the community and welcome within the Mennonite and Brethren denominations. Because neither Brethren Volunteer Service (BVS) nor Mennonite Voluntary Service (MVS) recognizes BMC as a placement site, Kay is serving through <a href="Lutheran Volunteer Corps"><u>Lutheran Volunteer Corps</u></a>. In addition to placement fees, it costs approximately \$13,000 per year to provide food, housing, health insurance, transportation and a small stipend to support the BMC volunteer.

## 4. Covenant Mennonite Fellowship Joins SCN

BMC is very pleased to welcome <u>Covenant Mennonite</u> <u>Fellowship</u> of Sarasota, Florida, as the newest member of the Supportive Communities Network as a congregation that is publicly affirming of lgbt people. Covenant Mennonite is a young, nontraditional and creative congregation that is deeply rooted in its Mennonite tradition and committed to living lives of healing, compassion, peace and justice. The congregation's pastor, Randy Spaulding, came out as a gay man in 2009. He was stripped of his credentials by the Southeast Mennonite



Conference, and the congregation was put on notice. After several years of dialogue and discussion with the Conference about the congregation's support of Randy, Covenant Mennonite eventually withdrew its membership from the Southeast Mennonite Conference. They are currently seeking membership in Central District Conference. It is a joy to welcome this justice seeking and genuinely welcoming congregation (now under the pastoral leadership of lim Miller) to SCN.

# 5. Denominational Conference Wrap-Up

BMC was present and active at both the Church of the Brethren Annual Conference in Charlotte, North Carolina and the Mennonite Church USA Assembly in Phoenix, Arizona this past summer.

In Charlotte, BMC hosted a booth in the exhibit hall that served as a relaxed collecting space for conference participants. In addition to the booth, BMC also sponsored a session on welcoming congregations and hosted a rich worship service that celebrated the addition of 10 new COB congregations to SCN in the past year. Phoenix was in the midst of a horrendous heat wave while the Mennonite Assembly was meeting. BMC joined with <u>Pink Menno</u> in organizing a conference within a conference, offering a hospitality room, worship service, and well attended workshops that dealt with a variety of topics that included: Coming Out, Sexual Ethics, Immigration and LGBT Rights,

Welcoming Congregations, Intersections of Oppression, Queering the Bible, and Gender 101. Pink gear was as popular as ever, as were the beautiful daily hymn sings organized by Pink Menno. A special photography project titled Strangers No More featured portraits of lgbtq Mennonites. A highlight of the conference was a very respectful and powerful public witness during a business session, where BMC board chair, Katie Hochstedler, read a <a href="mailto:prepared statement">prepared statement</a> that articulated the commitments, concerns and dreams of the welcoming movement.

### 8. Odds and Ends

Indiana Equality Action is seeking full-time Faith Organizers to work against HJR-6, a proposed "Marriage Discrimination Amendment" to Indiana's constitution. Organizers will work to mobilize members of faith communities to prevent the passage of this anti-lgbt bill. Experience in organizing work with faith communities and clergy is required. Law Supporting Same-Sex Marriage Passes the United Kingdom: In July, legislation to allow same-sex marriage in England and Wales was passed by the Parliament of the United Kingdom. In order to provide time for government departments to make necessary changes, the law is not expected to come into full force until 2014. The law provides the right for same-sex couples to marry, couples in civil partnerships to convert to marriage, and married men or women to change their sex without ending their marriage. The United Kingdom is now in the ranks of Argentina, Belgium, Brazil, Canada, Denmark, France, Iceland, Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, Portugal, Spain, South Africa, Sweeden, and Uraguay which have also legalized same-sex marriage.
